Abhimanyu Easwaran made his first-class debut in the 2013-14 season and has since established himself as a prolific opening batsman across formats. With an impressive first-class batting average of 48.87 in 101 matches, 47.03 in 89 List A games, and 37.53 in 34 T20s, he has consistently delivered strong performances.

He has been part of the Indian Test squad on tours to England, Australia, South Africa, and Bangladesh and has captained India A against England Lions and Bangladesh A. He has also led his state team in the Ranji Trophy and Duleep Trophy.

Easwaran has scored 27 first-class centuries, including six for India A, with three coming in away conditions. He has three double centuries in first-class cricket and holds an Indian record for scoring four consecutive first-class hundreds in four innings, a feat he shares with Parthiv Patel. Additionally, he holds a world record alongside Sir WG Grace and Ricky Ponting for scoring four consecutive first-class hundreds at the same ground.

In the Duleep Trophy, he has notched four centuries, including two in finals, and has also recorded two centuries in the Irani Trophy. Notably, he remains the youngest player from Bengal to score centuries in both innings of a match.

Recognized for his excellence, Easwaran has been named the Cricketer of the Year by the Cricket Association of Bengal on three occasions. He has also played in the Dhaka Premier League for three years.
