Riahn Pieris is a British Passport holding cricketer from Perth, Western Australia,

A right-handed stroke maker, Riahn often slots into the middle-order and is a hard hitting batsman who looks to be positive from ball one. After playing much of his Junior School Cricket in Sri Lanka, Riahn moved to Australia at the conclusion of his studies; and currently represents Swanbourne Cricket Club in the Western Australian Surburban Turf Cricket Association.

At 28-years-old, Pieris is an experienced individual who has played almost 150 career matches in the WASTCA. Last season, Riahn racked up 342 runs at an average of 26.31, this included two half-centuries and a top-score of 61 not out. In total he has racked up nearly 3000 runs across all formats, boasting a high score of 114.

The British Passport Holder has spent the 2024 season playing for Watford Town Cricket Club in Hertfordshire Cricket League and has impressed with nearly 1000 runs at a touch under 40 in all cricket and chipped in with 25 wickets also.

The Batting all-rounder is open to opportunities for the UK 2025 season.
